#### GREETINGS TO PASTORS' CONFERENCE

## By C. Roy Angell

Dr. C. Roy Angell, pastor of the Central Baptist Church in Miami, is general chairman of Convention arrangements. He is the host pastor for the Pastors! Conference. He is a native of Virginia, graduated from the University of Richmond, Crozer Seminary, Pennsylvania University and studied at the University of Virginia before coming to Florida. Stetson University gave him the honorary D.D. degree in 1945. He is a muchdemanded conference leader and evangelist.

Our church is indeed honored today to have sitting in its pews the greatest group of religious leaders in the Southland. The brotherhood of Baptist ministers is about the finest brotherhood in the world. There are no class distinctions among us. There is no bishop to whom we must make a bow. There is no one with authority to make life miserable for us nor by a favor to increase our salaries or remove us from the post to which the Lord has called us. Therefore, there is brotherhood, beautiful brotherhood.

When Dr. Warren wrote and asked if he could use our church for this Conference I was indeed elated, and I have looked forward to this minute, when I could stand up here and say to you, my brethren, you are more than welcome and we are more than glad that you have come.

We Baptists have the largest denomination in the city excepting the Catholic. There are forty-four Baptist churches and three missions with resident membership of more than 22,000. There is an enrolment of more than 6,000 in the Training Unions; more than 5,000 in the Woman's Missionary Unions; nearly 25,000 in the Sunday schools, and an enrolment of around 1,200 in the Brotherhoods.

So much publicity has been given to Miami as a summer and winter resort and to its race tracks and gambling centers that people across America think of it as being a very wicked city. I am sure that many will be surprised to know that it is a great church city and that the spiritual life of Miami is both beautiful and healthy. There are many lovely churches of every denomination and at the present time we have the happiest fellowship among our Baptist ministers and churches that we have ever had. We join hands in brotherhood to welcome the Southern Baptist Convention and to tell you that we will do everything in our power to make your stay in our fair city a happy and an interesting one.

We Baptist people in Miami will be your servants for these days. Command us and you will find a hearty response and a beautiful willingness to do our best to make your visit most delightful.
