Fields In Jamaica, Cuba For Conferences

NASHVILLE--(BP)--W. C. Fields, Nashville, Southern Baptist public relations leader, will direct stewardship conferences in Jamaica Mar. 24-30 at the request of the Jamaica Baptist Union.

He will consult with Southern Baptist missionaries and Cuban pastors during a three-day stop-over in Havana Apr. 1-3.

The Jamaican conferences have been arranged through a request by the Jamaica Baptist Union to the Foreign Mission Board of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Fields, public relations secretary for the Executive Committee of the SBC, said the conferences will be conducted at individual churches in Jamaica Mar. 24-26.

Following this, there will be a single conference for about 60 pastors and lay leaders at Moorlands, an interior city on the British island in the West Indies. The joint conference extends from Mar. 28-30.

Co-ordinator of the stewardship effort is J. A. Leo-Rhynie, pastor of East Queen St. Baptist Church, Kingston, Jamaica. Azariah McKenize of Kingston is general secretary of Jamaica Baptist Union.

Although Southern Baptists have no missionaries in Jamaica, the Foreign Mission Board of the Convention has assisted from time to time in conferences of various kinds.

Leo-Rhynie, in asking Southern Baptist help, said, "We are convinced the solution to so many of the problems confronting us in Jamaica will be contingent upon successfully putting over a stewardship program. We appreciate your excellent programs set up for the next few years and desire most sincerely to be included."

Fields said he would outline scriptural teachings on stewardship and discuss methods for promoting stewardship in the churches of Jamaica. "This activity is conducted with counsel from the office of stewardship promotion of the Executive Committee," he added. Merrill D. Moore of Nashville is secretary of stewardship promotion.

During his three-day visit in Havana, Fields will meet with Herbert Caudill, superintendent of Cuban missions for the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board, and with Cuban Baptist leaders. They will discuss Baptist work in Cuba.

The week following Fields' conferences in Jamaica, a group of Southern Baptist pastors from Texas and Louisiana will be there for evangelistic efforts. The two meetings will reinforce each other, according to Fields.

Dallas And Greenville Start Juvenile Work

ATLANTA, Ga.--(BP)--Appointment of directors for new juvenile rehabilitation programs in Dallas, Tex., and Greenville, S. C., indicate increasing interest in that work, according to J. V. James, Atlanta, superintendent of juvenile rehabilitation with Southern Baptists' Home Mission Board.

Ewing Cooley will direct the program in Dallas, and Jerry Autry was appointed for Greenville.

"The juvenile rehabilitation work is a church-centered associational program which deals directly with the courts in providing sponsors for wayward youths," James said.

"The increase in associations which employ directors encourages us that Southern Baptists are taking steps to combat delinquency and rehabilitate these young people."

Lexington, Ky., is considering a program of volunteer work under the direction of an associational juvenile rehabilitation committee, and several other cities have the program as suggested by the Home Mission Board under consideration, James says.

Conferences on juvenile rehabilitation have been promoted in some cities, James said, and the first such conferences will be conducted at Glorieta and Ridgecrest Baptist Assemblies during home mission weeks this year, with a workshop for juvenile rehabilitation workers being held at Ridgecrest.

Woman's Missionary
Union's New Books

BIRMINGHAM, Ala.--(BP)--"Woman's Missionary Union" by Miss Alma Hunt and "Educating Youth in Missions" by Mrs. Mildred (William) McMurry are two books to be released by Woman's Missionary Union, auxiliary of the Southern Baptist Convention with offices here.

These books are two of seven volumes authorized by the executive board of Woman's Missionary Union to strengthen the Baptist Jubilee Advance goals. They will be released this spring.

In "Woman's Missionary Union," Miss Hunt, of Birmingham, executive secretary of the Union, tells the background of the organization, its relationships to the Southern Baptist Convention, and its present program of missionary education.

Mrs. McMurry is director of the W M U's promotion division at Birmingham.

Other books in the series explain the principles underlying Woman's Missionary Union aims for advancement. They will be released to coincide with the Baptist Jubilee Advance emphasis for each year.

"Educating Youth in Missions" and "Woman's Missionary Union" undergird the leadership training emphasis of 1960, leaders here said. Published in 1959 was the first book in the series---"Christian Witnessing," by Miss Floy Barnard, retired dean of women, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Tex.

Authors for the remaining books have been secured and are already at work on their manuscripts. Mrs. Gordon Ussery of Roanoke, Ala., will discuss the aim, "Sharing Possessions," in her book to be released in 1961.

"Enlistment for Missions" by Mrs. Robert Fling, Seminole, Okla., recording secretary for W M U, will be released in 1962.

Mrs. Wilfred C. Tyler, of Blue Mountain, Miss., member of the executive board of the Union and wife of Blue Mountain College president, has been selected to write "World Awareness" for the 1963 emphasis.

Mrs. McMurry will be author of "Spiritual Life Development," to be published in 1964.

Panama City Survey:
21,856 Unchurched

PANAMA CITY, Fla.--(BP)--More than 43 per cent, or 21,856, of the population of Panama City are not church members, and 27 per cent of the 28,000 church members are unaffiliated.

These are figures reported by Billy Hargrove, of Atlanta, Ga., secretary of the department of survey and special studies of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board. Hargrove led the churches of the Northwest Coast Baptist Association in a comprehensive survey of the 50,176 residents of the area.

The churches surveyed 13,419 families in a one-week effort. They found 10,978 Baptists of which 2,192 were affiliated with no church. There are 3,442 Methodists, 2,034 Assembly of God, 1,495 Catholics, 1,176 Presbyterians, and all other groups have less than 700 members each.

Of the 12,287 non-Christians, 4,887 indicated no church preference; however, 2,286 indicated Southern Baptist preference. There are 16,231 Sunday school prospects for Baptist churches.

Hargrove was assisted by Ransome Swords of Atlanta, a member of the administrative services staff of the Home Mission Board, and Edward P. Burke of Winona, Miss., state Baptist missionary. Church field directors were Florida city missionaries in Panama City to train for the state-wide survey planned for 1961, and the greater Miami area for the October of this year.

"Under the leadership of Chaplain George Patterson, a survey was made of Tyndall Air Force Base nearby with 120 Protestant and Catholic surveyors in conjunction with the Panama City survey," Hargrove said.

Television was used for the first time in presenting the survey program to the public, and Hargrove reported that it aided in raising the percentage of completion by informing residents of the work.

The results of the survey will be used to pinpoint mission sites and other needs in the 30,000 Movement, a drive by the Southern Baptist Convention to start 20,000 missions and 10,000 churches by 1964.

Gallery Of Presidents
At Pastors' Conference

MIAMI BEACH, Fla.--(BP)--The president of the Southern Baptist Convention, the president of the American Baptist Convention, and Evangelist Billy Graham will appear on the program on the Pastors' Conference preliminary to the annual Southern Baptist Convention here May 16-17.

Pastors' Conference President W. O. Vaught, Jr., of Little Rock, Ark., released the program. Theme for the 1960 conference is "I Surrender All."

W. Ramsey Pollard, after April 1 pastor of Bellevue Baptist Church, Memphis, Tenn., serving his first term as Southern Baptist Convention president, addresses the Pastors' Conference in their opening session Monday morning, May 16.

Pollard's topic: "Unconditional Surrender."

Herbert J. Gezork, president of Andover-Newton Theological School, Newton Centre, Mass., and president of American Baptist Convention, brings his address Monday afternoon. Its topic: not yet announced.

Evangelist Billy Graham, ending his "Safari For Souls" in Africa, delivers the closing message of the conference on Tuesday afternoon under the title, "God's Man In A World of Revolution."

Another featured speaker is Theodore F. Adams, pastor, First Baptist Church, Richmond, Va., and president, Baptist World Alliance. Adams forecasts the soon-to-come Baptist World Congress. He speaks Monday afternoon, May 16.

The Congress is scheduled at Rio De Janeiro, Brazil, in late June, early July.

Several thousand Southern Baptist pastors from probably every state in the Union are expected to be present at the conference.

Special musical attractions for the Pastors' Conference include: Bellevue Church women's quartet from Memphis; Miss Joe Ann Shelton, soloist from the faculty of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, Tex.; Al and Ivy Walsh of Atlanta, Ga., and combined choirs led by Warren M. Angell, dean of music at Oklahoma Baptist University, Shawnee, Okla., and Mrs. Hoke A. Branham, Dallas, Tex.

Georgia Baptist Hospital
Seeks Government Loan

ATLANTA--(BP)--The Georgia Baptist Hospital in Atlanta was given approval here to submit a preliminary application to the federal Housing and Home Finance Agency for a loan of approximately \$2.5 million to finance construction of a proposed home for student nurses.

Approval came during the quarterly meeting of the executive committee of the Georgia Baptist Convention at the hospital.

Hospital Administrator Edwin B. Peel emphasized that the application is a preliminary one. The resolution, presented by Louie D. Newton, pastor of the Druid Hills Baptist Church in Atlanta and chairman of the hospital commission, said:

"It is understood that the application is preliminary only, and that complete details will be submitted at a subsequent meeting, and request made for final authority to proceed with loan and construction."

If erected as planned, the home will house about 500 student nurses in an 11-story building, the first three floors of which have already been completed as the nurses' educational building.

In other actions, the executive committee gave Truett-McConnell (Baptist) Junior College at Cleveland, Ga., permission to borrow up to \$50,000 to safeguard financing for a new boys' dormitory.

About 65 per cent of the cost of the dormitory has already been arranged through efforts of Atlanta and Bremen Businessman Warren P. Sewell, acting as fund-raising representative for the college.

Baptist Village, home for retired people in Waycross, was also authorized to borrow \$40,000 to complete construction of its second unit.

A special committee appointed in November to investigate the matter of bringing the Georgia Baptist Children's Home into the Cooperative Program reported: "Your committee feels that at this time it would be unwise to include the children's home in the Cooperative Program." The executive committee approved the committee's recommendation.

Searcy S. Garrison, executive secretary-treasurer, reported that receipts in Georgia for the Cooperative Program are up 15.7 per cent for the first two months of 1960 over the same period in '59.

They are interested in service in South America and hope to be appointed by the Southern Baptist Foreign Mission Board early in 1961.

They have one son, Paul, age 10. An older son, Wayne, died last October of leukemia.

Roy D. Gresham, executive secretary of the Maryland Baptist Union Association, read Hartfield's announcement to the board at its quarterly meeting here. The resignation was accepted.

The Hartfields are natives of Mississippi. He is a graduate of Mississippi College and of New Orleans Seminary. Mrs. Hartfield attended Mississippi College.

History Needs Helps From Biography Data

One of the most important sources of historical materials for Baptists is that of biographical sketches and formal biographies of denominational leaders.

The Historical Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention is endeavoring to gather in the files in Nashville biographical information on Baptist leaders, past and present. To accomplish this, the "Operation Baptist Biography" project was launched in the fall of 1958. It was hoped that 1959 would bring in a majority of biographical sketches of present day leaders and a good group of those of the past, but at the close of 1959 the operation was short of the goal.

The purpose of gathering information about leaders continues and the goal for 1960 is to secure biographical information on every person elected or appointed to office by the Southern Baptist Convention.

The Commission is more interested in securing the information about individuals than in having a "form" filled in. If churches or agencies have biographical information in the form of "personnel data" or "news release material" it is desired that such biographical information be submitted for the Commission's accumulative archives.

The Home Mission Board of the Convention has made use of "Operation Baptist Biography" materials in recent actions. When the board was ready to present the name of C. E. Autrey for director of evangelism, the publicity director called the Commission for the information on file regarding Autrey. This enabled the committee to have the needed information about Autrey to submit to the board.

Also, information was selected from the file when Leonard Sanderson resigned. This historical material proved to have very practical current usefulness.

Carlyle once wrote "the history of the world is but the biography of great men" and J. M. Dawson said "biography is the essence of history, and lends added interest to fact and philosophy."

The Historical Commission endeavors to emphasize this important method of sharing historical information and preserving historical materials.

More books of biography need to be written; more biographical features need to be published in Baptist papers, and hundreds of biographical sketches need to be cataloged in Commission files.
