FT. WORTH CHURCH HAS
GIGANTIC NEW ORGAN

FT. WORTH, Tex. --(BP)-- The largest organ ever to be installed in any church in the Southwest has recently been placed in the new Broadway Baptist Church in Fort Worth.

The beautiful 92-rank instrument cost \$75,000 and has 5,585 pipes ranging from two inches to thirty-two feet. Four boxes were required to ship it from the little town of St. Hyacinth, Quebec, where it was built.

E. A. Scarborough is minister of music at the Broadway Church, Miss Helen Joyce is organist and H. Guy Moore is pastor.
