## World In Miami

1. Miami Beach Auditorium -- The world mission program of Southern Baptists in their annual meeting will be discussed in this beautiful setting.
2. Miami International Airport -- Nearly 200,000 people pass through this airport into the United States each year, and many are leaving for the Americas. This is the "Gateway to South America."
3. Pier Scene -- Miami, a fisherman's paradise, and also a booming industry which supplies an abundance of seafood to the eastern United States.
4. Leadership -- Mission leaders in Miami are J. Ray Dobbins, right, Superintendent of City Missions; center, Floyd Folsom, pastor, Miami Shores Baptist Church, chairman of Missions Committee; and, left, R. P. Tomlinson, pastor, First Baptist Church, Hialeah, past chairman of Missions Committee.
5. Latin American leaders in the Association -- Latin American work is organized for a total associational mission program. These are some of the leaders for their associational work.
6. Co-operation -- Dr. John McGuire, left, Florida State Executive Secretary, Dr. Courts Redford, right, Executive Secretary, Home Mission Board, and Dr. Arthur Rutledge, center, Director of Division of Missions, Home Mission Board. The Florida Baptist Convention, the Miami Association, and the Home Mission Board co-operate in ministering to the "World in Miami."
7. Missionary Family -- The Genus Crenshaws are missionaries to the Seminole Indians near Miami.
8. Hungarian Refugees -- These Hungarian refugees can smile because here they have found security. They have been reached for Christ through a mission sponsored for Hungarians by the Shenandoah Baptist Church in Miami.
9. Chinese Family -- Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Chow, twins, Alan and Alvin, center, Dennis. The Flagler Street Baptist Church sponsors a mission with the Chinese. About 150 are being reached.
10. Russian Sign -- The Russian Baptist Church of Miami has recently acquired a building for its congregation.
11. Frank Ramirez, migrant worker in Florida -- Rev. Ramirez greets two agricultural migrants who professed faith in Christ as a result of his ministry and were baptized in a nearby Baptist church.
12. Miami Baptist Association -- Little Elizabeth Rimblas feels at home on the steps of the Miami Baptist Association because the Baptist churches in Miami are working together to tell the story of Jesus to her people.
13. Mrs. Umbelina Landera speaking to Latin American W.M.U. group in Miami. Mrs. Landera was a first Sunbeam under the leadership of one of our first missionaries to Cuba. Mrs. Landera visits Latin Americans in Miami and across the Convention to encourage them in the work of Woman's Missionary Union.
14. Baptist Book Store -- Milton Leach, Jr., extreme right, Director of Language Work in Miami, is assisted in his work by the Baptist Book Store. A section

in the Book Store is for Latin American books and helps.

15. Four Girls -- Scores of boys and girls in Miami are made happy because they are taught the word of God through the starting of many new missions and churches.

16. Latin American Church -- There are some very beautiful and well-equipped Latin American churches in Miami.

17. Anglo Church -- Many of the churches in Miami, while sponsoring mission places, have found it necessary to add to their own buildings.
