TEXAS BROTHERHOOD MAN
GOES TO NEW MEXICO POST

DALLAS, Tex.--(BP)--Howard C. Sivells, associate secretary of the Brotherhood Department of the Baptist General Convention of Texas since 1950, has been elected Brotherhood secretary of the Baptist Convention of New Mexico. He will succeed Roy F. Sutton, now pastor of a new Baptist church in Denver, Colo.

Since 1951, Sivells has served as editor of Texas Brotherhood News, a quarterly publication sent to all Brotherhood presidents over the state.

He is a graduate of Howard Payne College, received the M.A. degree from North Texas State College, studied medicine at Baylor Medical School, and did graduate work at the University of Texas.

He will go to New Mexico in June.
