MILLEN, Ga. --(BP)-- Members of the Fellowship Prayer Band of the First Baptist Church here have agreed to quit attending motion picture theaters "in protest to the large number of scenes showing drinking."

The group described drinking scenes as "detrimental to the morals of our young people."

Rev. Jordan W. Holland, pastor of the church, asked the entire church membership to write protests on such scenes to Eric Johnson, president of the Motion Picture Association of American with headquarters in Washington,

"When enough people protest, this terrible, greedy evil will be curbed," he said.
