IN WOMAN'S MISSIONARY TRAINING SCHOOL**

LOUISVILLE, Kentucky--(BP)--Dr. Hugh A. Brimm, of Louisville, Kentucky, has been named professor of human relations in the Woman's Missionary Union Training School, according to an announcement by Miss Emily Lansdell, president. Dr. Brimm leaves the position of executive secretary of the Social Service Commission of the Southern Baptist Convention to assume his duties at the Training School on January 1, 1953.

By training Dr. Brimm is well qualified in his field. His A.B. degree came from Mississippi College, Clinton, Mississippi. He received the Th.M. and Th.D. degrees from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. He has done graduate study at the University of Wisconsin, Yale University, and the University of North Carolina.

His experience, in addition to his work with the Social Service Commission since 1947, includes that of pastor at Quincey, Florida, and of head of the Sociology Department of Mercer University in Macon, Georgia.

Dr. Brimm's wife is the former Miss Verna Mae Bingham, of Memphis, Tennessee. They have a six-year-old daughter, Martha Carol.

**CALIFORNIA SETS  
\$200,000 BUDGET**

BAKERSFIELD, Calif.--(BP)--California Southern Baptists have set a \$200,000 Cooperative Program goal for next year to be divided, after expenses, 75 per cent to state and 25 per cent to Southern Convention causes.

The Convention meeting here October 29-31 also (1) voted to invite the Southern Baptist Convention to establish a major hospital in the Los Angeles area, (2) establish a children's home at Formosa, and (3) organize a Baptist Foundation with Julian L. Stenstrom as executive secretary.

Dr. A. L. Aulick, teacher at Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary, was elected president of the convention. Next year's convention will be held in Santa Barbara, November 3-5.

MISSOURI ADOPTS  
\$1,250,000 GOAL

ST. JOSEPH, Mo.--(BP)--Missouri Baptists have voted a \$1,250,000 budget for next year. The action was taken in the annual association meeting here October 28-30. The first \$1,050,000 will be Cooperative Program to be divided, after expenses, \$482,500 to state causes and \$482,500 to Convention-wide causes. The remaining \$200,000 will go to state capital needs, including a \$65,000 press building.

The association also (1) voted fuller co-operation with the Temperance League of Missouri in effort to secure local option for the state, (2) set up a committee to study and propose a ten-year program, (3) decided to establish a committee on ordination to advise with churches when requested on ordination problems, and (4) heard a proposed constitutional amendment to be voted on next year for increasing number of state board members.

Fred C. Eastham, Springfield, was re-elected moderator. Next year's association will be held at Sedalia on October 27-29.

MYERS AND TURNER  
TO BOOK STORE DEPARTMENT

NASHVILLE, Tenn.--(BP)--Appointment of Jay O. Turner and Truett Myers, as assistants to the director of the Book Store Department of the Baptist Sunday School Board, has been announced by Harold E. Ingraham, business manager of the Board.

Turner will assist in the supervision of administrative and promotional work. Myers will be in charge of audio-visual aids sales and promotion in the book stores.

A native of Kansas, Turner is a graduate of William Jewell College and served with the Civil Aeronautics Administration for four years before joining the Board's staff in 1946. During the six years Turner has been with the Board, sales of general books published by the Broadman Press, publishing agency of the Board, have steadily increased. In 1951 the sale of Broadman books more than doubled over the previous year.

Myers is a native of Texas. He received his A.B. degree in Bible and English literature from Baylor University and a Bachelor of Divinity degree from the Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary. While attending this Seminary he served as full-time pastor of the First Baptist Church, Fairfield-Suisan, California. Before coming to the Board, Myers served as audio-visual aids worker for the Baptist Book Store, Fresno, California. He has worked with the audio-visual aids section of the Sunday School Board since 1949.
