Kammerling Will Edit Southern Baptist Journal



COLUMBIA, S.C.(BP) -- The "Southern Baptist Journal," a private publication formed in 1973 to expose Southern Baptist "liberals," has moved to South Carolina under the direction of a new editor.

Russell Kammerling, 31, pastor of First Baptist Church, West Columbia, S.C., has replaced William Powell as editor. Powell will continue to live in Buchanan, Ga., and serve as publisher of the 10,000 circulation paper. He will also continue as executive vice president of the Baptist Faith and Message Fellowship.

Powell said his main role will be fund raising. He told Baptist Press the BFMF has "achieved its first major goal," to alert Southern Baptist leadership of "liberals" in SBC life. Phase two, he said, will be a concerted effort to raise funds to get the Southern Baptist Journal in the hands first of every Southern Baptist pastor and then every deacon chairman and WMU director.

The Journal, begun as a monthly, has been published less often than that because of financial problems. Kammerling said it will publish monthly effective April 1. He said that he, as editor, will have complete editorial control.

He said the paper will continue as a voice for exposing liberalism but, "We won't be after liberal people as much as dealing with trends and issues."

Asked if this was a change in policy, he said, "This is not a change in direction as much as methodology. In the past we haven't been as careful to state the cause as we should. We can't separate people from issues but will focus on the issues and not name names of individuals without documented evidence. We won't be in the business of character assassination."

Kammerling is a brother-in-law of Paige Patterson, president of the Criswell Center for Biblical Studies, Dallas, Texas, who was one of the principals in efforts last year in Houston to elect an SBC president committed to biblical inerrancy.

Asked if there was a direct connection between the Criswell Center and the Southern Baptist Journal, Kammerling said, "We may deal with similar issues but there will be no direct relationship. We're not a news arm for them."

Kammerling has been pastor of the West Columbia church for almost three years. A native of Beaumont, Texas, he is a graduate of Lamar University, Beaumont. He earned a master of divinity degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Fort Worth, studying in the doctor of ministries program of Luther Rice Seminary, Texas, and is Jacksonville, Fla.

Music Conference Touches Both Ends Baptist Press 4/2/80

ST. LOUIS (BP) -- Choirs and seminars featuring senior adults to children will command the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Church Music Conference June 8-9 in St. Louis.

The conference, to be held at Third Baptist Church, 620 N. Grand Blvd., is one of a series of meetings surrounding the Southern Baptist Convention June 10-12 at the Cervantes Convention Center.

The meeting features premiere performances of three commissioned anthems: an adult chorale by Warren Angell, music dean emeritus, Oklahoma Baptist University, entitled "He is God--the King of Glory;" an older children's chorale by Roberta Bitgood, president of American Guild of Organists, entitled "My Heart is Ready, O God;" and an instrumental duet arranged for piano and organ by Don Hustad and Ron Boud, music faculty, Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, entitled "Come, Ye Thankful People, Come."

Primary speakers include C. Bernard Ruffin, a Lutheran from Alexandria, Va., who will deliver an address on Fanny Crosby, the prolific, blind hymnwriter of the late 19th century who produced such hymns as "Blessed Assurance" and "Rescue the Perishing;" Kenneth Chafin, author and pastor of South Main Baptist Church, Houston, who will bring the devotional messages; Thad Roberts Jr., minister of music, South Main Baptist Church, Houston, and president of the Southern Baptist Church Music Conference, who will bring the president's message; and Wesley Coffman, chairman, department of the arts at Dallas Baptist College, who will speak on understanding and working with the boy's changing voice.

The opening session begins at 6:45 p.m. June 8 with a variety of musical presentations. It includes a creative worship by William J. Reynolds of the School of Sacred Music at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary and concludes with a reception honoring Reynolds and his wife.

A new gavel, which will be used to call the opening session to order, was handcrafted by Wade Melton, a craftsman at South Main Baptist Church, from a cedar limb taken from a tree in the front yard of the birthplace of the late B.B. McKinney in Heflin, La.

Special interest seminars on the afternoon of June 9 include: more on the boy's changing voice, by Wesley Coffman; organizing a senior adult choir in your church, by John Sawyer, minister of music at Immanuel Baptist Church, Tulsa, Okla.; and music in foreign missions, by Bill Ichter, the first music missionary to Brazil.

Sawyer's senior adult choir, the Heart Throbs, will present a mini-concert preceding the special interest session.

This 24th annual meeting of the church music conference will mark the final public appearance of Euell Porter with his A Cappella Choir from Baylor University before his retirement. That concert will be at 8 p.m. June 9.

Other musical groups and choirs will include: the Illinois Church Musicians; Jo Deen Blaine, organist and music associate at Westbury Baptist Church, Houston, Texas, with several organ recitals; Adult Choir, First Baptist Church, Memphis, Tenn.; the Singing Illinoisians; Older Children's Choir, First Baptist Church, Jefferson City, Mo.; Missouri Baptist College Choir; Susan Slaughter, principal trumpet, St. Louis Symphony Orchestra; Clint Nichols, chairman, division of church music, New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary; and the Missouri Singing Men.

High Court Declines Mo. Obscenity Appeal

WASHINGTON (BP) -- The U.S. Supreme Court will not disturb a ruling by the Supreme Court of Missouri which prevents police from suppressing allegedly obscene materials until a search warrant for their seizure is issued.

The case, Missouri v. All Star News agency, a St. Louis distributor of obscene films and magazines, involves a Missouri law providing for seizure and destruction of such materials. The law allowed police to serve the distributor with a notice that they were challenging the allegedly obscene materials in court. It prevented the distributor, under the threat of contempt of court, from removing any of the challenged articles from its warehouse.

Also under threat of contempt, the distributor was forbidden to continue selling the materials.

Last October, the Missouri Supreme Court ruled that the articles had been subjected to an unconstitutional "prior restraint" between the time the notice of adversary hearing was served and the time the search warrant was issued, a period of 10 days.

Missouri Attorney General John Ashcroft then asked the nation's high court to review that decision, claiming the First Amendment's free speech clause should not prevent states from suppressing obscene materials during the brief period between filing the adversary notice and obtaining the search warrant.

But the high court, which has long taken a dim view of such prior restraint laws, decided instead to let the Missouri ruling stand.

Pastors' Conference Seeks To 'Unify and Strengthen'

ST. LOUIS (BP) -- The Southern Baptist Pastors' Conference, scheduled here June 8-9 at the Cervantes Convention Center, will aim at providing "a unifying and strengthening influence on Southern Baptists," according to James T. Draper, conference president.

Draper, pastor of First Baptist Church, Euless, Texas, said the conference, which precedes the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention, June 10-12, will begin at 6:15 p.m. under the theme, "Bold Preaching of a Bold Gospel."

He said the Pastors' Conference will distribute for the first time a printed budget of costs for the meeting before it takes its annual offering for support.

Last year's conference fell \$2,300 short of expenses, a deficit eventually made up by First Baptist Church, Jacksonville, Fla., where last year's Pastors' Conference President Homer Lindsay Jr. is pastor.

Draper, who said he will personally see that any deficit this year is raised, also announced he has formed a three-person liaison committee to consult with the SBC Executive Committee in on-going decisions about physical arrangements for future Pastors' Conferences. Gerald Martin, president of Hannibal-LaGrange College, Hannibal, Mo., chairs the committee, also made up of Don Berry, pastor of Parker Memorial Baptist Church, Anniston, Ala., and Draper.

About nine of the 13 preachers featured at this year's conference have never preached at the Pastors' Conference before, Draper said.

"I wanted to have a very positive and inspirational program with a cross section of preachers," he said. "Most are pastors, others are Bible conference speakers and denominational leaders."

John Bisagno, pastor of First Baptist Church, Houston, will lead off the speakers Sunday night, June 8, with a message on "The Second Coming." Jack Taylor, Bible conference speaker from Fort Worth, will also deliver a message on "Prayer and Awakening." Draper will preside.

The pastors will be welcomed by Rheubin South, executive secretary for Missouri Baptists, and Adrian Rogers, president of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Monday morning the pastors will hear messages by Ralph H. Langley, pastor of First Baptist Church, Huntsville, Ala., on "Christ-My Priest;" Joel Gregory, pastor of Gambrell Street Baptist Church, Fort Worth, Texas, on "Only Christ Crucified;" George H. Harris, pastor of Castle Hills Baptist Church, San Antonio, Texas, on "What God Wants in Us;" and Richard Jackson, pastor of North Phoenix Baptist Church, Phoenix, Ariz., on "In the Meantime."

Larry Lewis, Pastors' Conference vice president and pastor of Tower Grove Baptist Church, St. Louis, Mo., will preside at the Monday morning session.

Messages for the Monday afternoon session, where Draper will preside, will be "Revival Through the Word" by Stan Coffey, pastor, First Baptist Church, Albuquerque, N.M.; "A New Testament Strategy for Reaching People" by Bailey Stone, pastor of First Baptist Church, Odessa, Texas; and "Victory is Ours" by Grady C. Cothen, president of the Sunday School Board, Nashville, Tenn.

Officers will be elect d during the Monday afternoon session.

The final session Monday night will feature messages by Roy Fish, professor of evangelism at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, on "Let's Major on the Major;" William G. Tanner, executive director of the Home Mission Board, Atlanta, Ga., on "Honorable Vessels;" Bailey Smith, pastor of First Southern Baptist Church, Del City, Okla., on "A Babbling Preacher and a Strange Gospel;" and W.A. Criswell, pastor of First Baptist Church, Dallas, Texas, on "Old Time Religion."

Tanner To Replace Cothen On BJCPA Search Committee Baptist Press 4/2/80

WASHINGTON (BP) -- William G. Tanner, executive director-treasurer of the Southern Baptist Home Mission Board, has been named as a replacement for Grady C. Cothen on the search committee seeking a new chief executive for the Baptist Joint Committee on Public Affairs.

Cothen, recovering from surgery for an abdominal malignancy, had earlier been named chairman of the search committee. The other SBC representative on the panel is Harold C. Bennett, executive secretary-treasurer of the Executive Committee.

According to Baptist Joint Committee Chairman Gideon K. Zimmerman, the search committee will name a new chairman when it meets May 5 in Chicago.
