WMU CONVENTION
TO MEET IN HOUSTON

NORFOLK, Va.--(BP)--Mrs. George R. Martin, president, Southern Baptist Woman's Missionary Union has announced that their annual convention will convene May 3 in the Music Hall, Houston, Tex., and that the theme for the program will be "A Story to Tell."

The first session of the meeting will open in the Music Hall on Sunday afternoon at 3:00. The evening session will begin at 7:30 p.m. There will be three sessions on Monday, two in the Music Hall and the evening service in the Coliseum, adjacent to the Music Hall. Three Tuesday sessions will all meet in the Coliseum. The convention will end with the Tuesday evening service.

Mrs. Troy Campbell, Houston, is chairman of music. D. K. Harrell, Houston, will be song leader, and Mrs. George Wilcox, Corpus Christi, soloist.

Choirs from Baylor University and Southwestern Seminary will give special numbers.

Houston headquarters for the Woman's Missionary Union will be the Lamar Hotel.

SURVEY SHOWS
FAITHFULNESS

PLANT CITY, Fla.--(BP)--Out of twenty-one people who joined the First Baptist Church here in a one week revival conducted ten years ago, sixteen are still active members and five have joined other churches. L. Don Miley, pastor, said that a check on the meeting revealed unusually high faithfulness.

In March, 1943, the pastor conducted his first revival at this church. He was disappointed because so few came, but a survey this year revealed that it was a very profitable meeting.

Of the sixteen who still are active in his church, he found that one is a football coach, another is a dentist, four are public school teachers and four are Sunday school teachers. One is a Training Union Director. Three are members of the senior choir. One has directed the youth choir, served as church organist, and is now organist for a neighboring church. One is a volunteer for special service. Another is a deacon, assistant treasurer and chairman of the ushers. One young man has been ordained to the ministry and will graduate from the Southern Baptist Seminary in June, and another young person was married at the close of service Easter Sunday morning.

DR. J. M. DAWSON ANNOUNCES
RETIREMENT FROM COMMISSION

WASHINGTON, D. C. --(BP)--Dr. Joseph M. Dawson, executive director of the Baptist Joint Committee on Public Affairs, has announced his retirement.

He asked the committee to be relieved of the position during his forthcoming seventy-fifth year. At the insistence of Baptist leaders he agreed to remain until next fall.

A special committee from the six Baptist conventions supporting the committee's work will be named by Dr. Edward B. Willingham, president of the joint agency, to develop a plan of procedure for naming his successor.

Dr. Dawson has held the post for the past seven years. Previously, he had been a minister in Texas and for thirty-one years held the pastorate of First Baptist Church, Waco, the campus church of Baylor University.

He is the author of several books on church-state relations.

"I have been proud to pioneer in the first major joint undertaking ever to effect cooperation of these six Baptist conventions in this work," Dr. Dawson said, "and am encouraged by its success. I think it augurs well for the future."

DR. A.L. AULICK
RETIRES IN JUNE

BERKELEY, Calif.--(BP)--The close of the spring semester at Golden Gate Seminary, Berkeley, Calif., will end five years of service as Greek and New Testament professor for Dr. A.L. Aulick. The retiring teacher was elected professor emeritus at the December 12 meeting of the board of trustees.

Dr. Aulick will be available for teaching and other services to the seminary, according to Dr. Harold K. Graves, president. Dr. Graves expressed the seminary's gratitude for Dr. Aulick's contribution to its growth.

In 1947 Dr. Aulick came to Berkeley as head of the Department of Greek and New Testament. Previously, he had taught Bible in Oklahoma Baptist University, Shawnee, and held pastorates in Arkansas, Texas, and Oklahoma. He is president of California Southern Baptists.

Dr. Aulick holds the A.B. degree from the University of New Mexico, the Th.B. from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, the B.D. and A.M. from Colgate University and the Th.D. from the University of Dubuque. He is a native of Kentucky.
