GREENVILLE, S. C. -- (BP)--George A. Christenberry, dean of the men's college and professor of biology at Furman University, has resigned to become president of Shorter College, Rome, Ga., effective July 1, Dr. John L. Plyler, president of Furman University, announced today.

Dr. Christenberry will succeed Dr. Charles Watson Burts, who resigned the Shorter presidency to return to Furman University, where he was formerly a member of the faculty, to become director of graduate studies and professor of psychology.

Christenberry is a native of Macon, Ga. He received the B. S. degree from Furman University, M. A. and the Ph.D. degrees from the University of North Carolina. Before coming to Furman he served as head of the biology department at Meredith College.
