DIRECTOR OF MUSIC
APPOINTED FOR 1954 SBC

TULSA, Okla.--(BP)--Warren Angell, Oklahoma Baptist University, Shawnee, Okla., has been named to direct the music for the Southern Baptist Convention meeting in St. Louis, Mo., next June, J. W. Storer, president of the Convention, announced recently.

Dr. Angell, for thirteen years dean of the college of fine arts of Oklahoma Baptist University, has a choral reputation in college glee clubs, church music and community choral work. While working on the Ed.D. degree at Columbia University, he was top tenor of the Fred Waring Glee Club. He holds the B.M. and M.M. degrees from Syracuse University.

He has been director of the "choral laboratory" for several years at the Convention-wide Baptist Assembly at Ridgecrest, N. C., and was director of music for the Southern Baptist Convention held in Oklahoma City in 1950.
