**SOUTHEASTERN ENROLS 318  
STUDENTS FOR FALL TERM**

WAKE FOREST, N. C.--(BP)--Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary set a goal of 300 for fall enrolment. On August 27 the goal had been reached with eighteen to spare. The three hundredth man was a tall black haired young preacher from North Charleston, S. C. Paul M. Pridgen, who is 6½ feet tall and weighs 230 pounds, came to Southeastern, he said, "because it is fast-growing, has a wonderful faculty, and is in an area where I expect to do my life's work."

L. L. Carpenter, Raleigh, N. C., editor of the Biblical Recorder, delivered the convocation address. His topic was "Basic Needs of the Christian Ministry." He cited four requirements: (1) called and dedicated men, (2) educated men, (3) clear seeing men, (4) hardworking men.

Three new faculty members, Dr. Pope Duncan, Dr. C. E. Hendricks, and Dr. Richard Young, signed the Seminary's articles of faith.
